Prayers of Thanksgiving

Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good. His love endures forever.

Psalm 136:1

Psalm 136 calls believers to give thanks for many reasons, the main one being that God's gracious love -- His forgiveness and mercy in Jesus Christ -- endures forever. Similarly, Saint Paul admonishes us to "give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thessalonians 5:18).

The question that comes to mind when reading such a passage is how can we give thanks when we are sick, lose our job or a loved one, or even find ourselves in other sad circumstances? The answer is that God still loves us! Especially in bad times, God draws us to Himself in a special show of love and reveals Himself as a mighty and merciful helper. An uplifting experience for us Christians is to begin our daily prayers with thanksgiving -- with thanks to God for His Word, for our Savior and the Spirit-created faith in Him, for our church, our family and friends, our health, hope, money, home, Ford 150's (ok, had to add it), and other blessings. Praying with thankful hearts comes from the conviction that God is good and that His love for us in Christ endures forever.

Therefore, with another Thanksgiving before us, let's start our prayers with thanking our Living Lord for all the blessings received, especially the free gift of eternal life. But even when our earthly journey is partly cloudy or the road traveled is a tad rocky, our tongues and voices can still proclaim "thanks be to God"—for yes, He is good, but His love for us in Christ endures forever.
